MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE MONETT CITY COUNCIL WORK SESSION
October 2nd, 2025

I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m.

II. Pledge

III. Approval of Agenda

IV. Regular Business

A. Discussion Regarding Business License

City Administrator Mickey Ary discussed moving to annual renewals. Staff will send letters 30 days prior to renewal; currently 20 businesses do not comply. Council discussed reviewing codes and enforcement procedures. A work group will be formed to review business license processes, with Mayor Burke volunteering to serve.

B. Discussion Regarding Fire Truck & Training Facility

Chief Pennington provided updates on new fire apparatus:

- **Cub Nation Truck:** Passenger side for vehicle accidents, driver side for fires; delivery expected June 2026.
- **Rescue Pumper (Engine):** Replacing Rescue 15; old truck retained as reserve.
- **Ladder Truck:** Current 1996 Pierce 75' ladder truck exceeds lifetime; replacement proposed via lease-purchase. Budget overage requires council approval. Chief recommended vendors: 1) Pierce 107', 2) E-One 100', 3) Rosenbauer.
- **Training Facility:** Collaboration with Chief Daoud to build behind Police Department; addresses ISO points, reduces training costs, and allows for multi-department training. Facility estimated at \$696,148.52 (concrete work not including in estimate) with potential cost-sharing from other agencies.

Plans include hosting spring fire academies and Fire 1 & 2 classes in partnership with schools.

- **Command Vehicle Upgrade:** Approved by Council; will serve as a command post for emergency calls and mutual aid. Funding will be partially provided from the ambulance sale (\$6,600). Total project cost is \$11,000 (camper shell – \$3,800; slide-out tray – \$7,290).

C. Discussion Regarding the Proposed Dog Park

City Administrator Ary provided updates on proposed dog park at 901 E Broadway, using the building at 913 E Broadway for restrooms and storage. Maintenance agreement to be drafted by city attorney. Resolution scheduled for council vote Oct 16, with construction targeted for next spring. Discussion included back gate access, operation hours, and animal licensing.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MONETT, MISSOURI DIRECTING THAT THE QUESTION “SHALL A COMMISSION BE CHOSEN TO FRAME A CHARTER?” AND THE LIST OF CANDIDATES FOR THAT COMMISSION BE SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS TO PROVIDE FOR THE INITIATION OF THE PROCESS TO EXPLORE WHETHER MONETT SHOULD BECOME A CONSTITUTIONAL CHARTER CITY, AND DIRECTING THAT THE QUESTION “SHALL A COMMISSION BE CHOSEN TO FRAME A CHARTER?” AND THE LIST OF CANDIDATES FOR THAT COMMISSION BE PLACED ON THE BALLOT FOR THE LOCAL ELECTION IN APRIL OF 2026 TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS WITHIN THE CITY OF MONETT, BARRY AND LAWRENCE COUNTY, MISSOURI.

WHEREAS, Article VI, Section 19 of the Missouri Constitution allows a city such as Monett to frame and adopt a charter for its own form of government; and

WHEREAS, the City of Monett in Barry and Lawrence Counties, Missouri, is able to initiate the process of becoming a constitutional charter city by submitting the question to the voters, **“Shall a Commission be chosen to frame a charter?”**; and

WHEREAS, the City inhabitants must also select 13 commissioners for the Charter Commission to draft a potential Charter to be presented to the voters; and

WHEREAS, candidates for the Commission for the Charter shall be nominated by petition signed by not less than two percent of the qualified electors voting at the next preceding city election, and filed with the election body or official at least thirty days prior to the election but that one thousand electors' signatures shall be sufficient to nominate a candidate; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to initiate the process of becoming a constitutional charter city by submitting the question to the voters, **“Shall a Commission be chosen to frame a charter?”** and submitting the list of candidates for the Charter Commission; and

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it necessary and advisable to change the form of government from 3rd class commission form of government to constitutional charter form of government; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Monett is ready to transition to a Charter form of government and wishes to present the question and list of candidates to the voters; and

WHEREAS, such a change to the form of government to constitutional charter city shall begin with this ordinance placing the question on the ballot of forming a Charter Commission and electing 13 highest vote getters; and if the question is

approved then the Commission will meet to determine and construct a charter to present to voters to ultimately effectuate the change; and

WHEREAS, the City has a population of over 9000 inhabitants according to the U.S. Census which meets the requirement of a population over 5000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONETT, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The following question shall be submitted to the voters of the City of Monett, Missouri, in the April 2026 election, “Shall a commission be chosen to frame a charter?”

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified voters of the City of Monett, Missouri, for their approval, as required Article VI of Section 19 of the Missouri Constitution at the election hereby called and to be held in the City on Tuesday, the 7th day of April, 2026. The ballot of submission shall contain substantially the following language:

PROPOSITION NUMBER ONE

Shall a commission be chosen to frame a charter?

☐ **YES**

☐ **NO**

If you are in favor of the question, place an "X" in the box opposite "YES".

If you are opposed to the question, place an "X" in the box opposite "NO".

Section 3. The ballot for the April 2026 election shall also contain the names or groups of names of the electors of the City who are candidates for the Commission, said candidates having qualified pursuant to Section 19 of Article VI of the Missouri Constitution. If a majority of the electors voting on the question contained in Section 1 vote in the affirmative, the thirteen (13) candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall constitute the Commission.

Section 4. If said question posed is voted in the affirmative, the thirteen (13) candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall, as the Commission, meet and deliberate as is necessary to draft a charter that may then be submitted to the electorate for approval pursuant to Section 19 of Article VI of the Missouri Constitution. The City shall pay all necessary expenses of the Commission.

Section 5. The City Clerk shall notify the County Clerks of Barry and Lawrence Counties, Missouri, in writing to conduct said election during the local election in accordance with the applicable laws.

Section 6. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect ten days from and after its passage and approval.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Planning & Zoning Commission held their regular meeting on Wednesday, August 27, 2025, with three items on the agenda. All items pertain to the North Hills subdivision. Re: Dog Park proposal by Monett Main Street

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Monett Main Street has collected funding for a dog park to be in the downtown district of the City of Monett. The project was halted due to FEMA restriction on the original site. Therefore, an alternate location was sought but due to a deed restriction the site was not feasible. The third potential site is in the downtown district at 901 E. Broadway Street. This site also includes a city owned building at 913 E. Broadway. The desire of Monett Main Street is to utilize the building for storage and potentially a bathroom. Each situation has delayed the construction of a dog park.

PROPOSAL

Monett Main Street has submitted a letter (attached) of request to the City of Monett. The letter is requesting the city owned property at 901 East Broadway Street be used for the location of the downtown dog park. The city also owns a building on the same lot located at 913 East Broadway Street. The initial conversations with city staff and members of the Monett Main Street have suggested street parking for those who use the facilities. The section of Broadway closest to the proposed facilities is marked as parallel parking. The count appears to be adequate for this usage.

The City Council requested at the July 10, 2025 Work Session that the City Administrator put together a focus group to discuss pros/cons of a dog park. The focus group met on Tuesday September 9, 2025. Present were Dr. Erin Carnes (veterinarian), Larry Howard (City parks), Ken Gaspar (Commissioner), Bob Berger (Monett Main Street), Karen Griggs (City animal control officer), Mike Gervais (City communications), Alyssa Vaughn (Monett Main Street) and Mickey Ary (City Administrator). Thad Hood (original planner of the dog park) was invited but not available to attend. A list of Pros and Cons was created. The pro/con list is included.

A 'straw poll' was conducted and everyone present supported moving forward with the construction of the dog park at the 901 East Broadway location.

RECOMMENDATION

City staff have recommended a Development Agreement between the City of Monett and Monett Main Street for improvements on the property resulting in a dog park. The facilities and improvements would be fully funding by Monett Main Street. The property would remain with the City of Monett. After completion of the improvements the City of Monett will take ownership of maintenance.

The Development Agreement shall specify the overall size of the dog park, distinguish large dog/small dog amenities, shelter facilities and/or structures, service needs such as water, and self-maintenance stands for bags/containers for dog waste.

Pursuit of Council directive, the City Attorney will draft the Development Agreement and Resolution.

We hereby request that City Council withdraw the ordinance passed in 2024 and make arrangements to retain the parking lot at the old Monett Times building as a city lot.

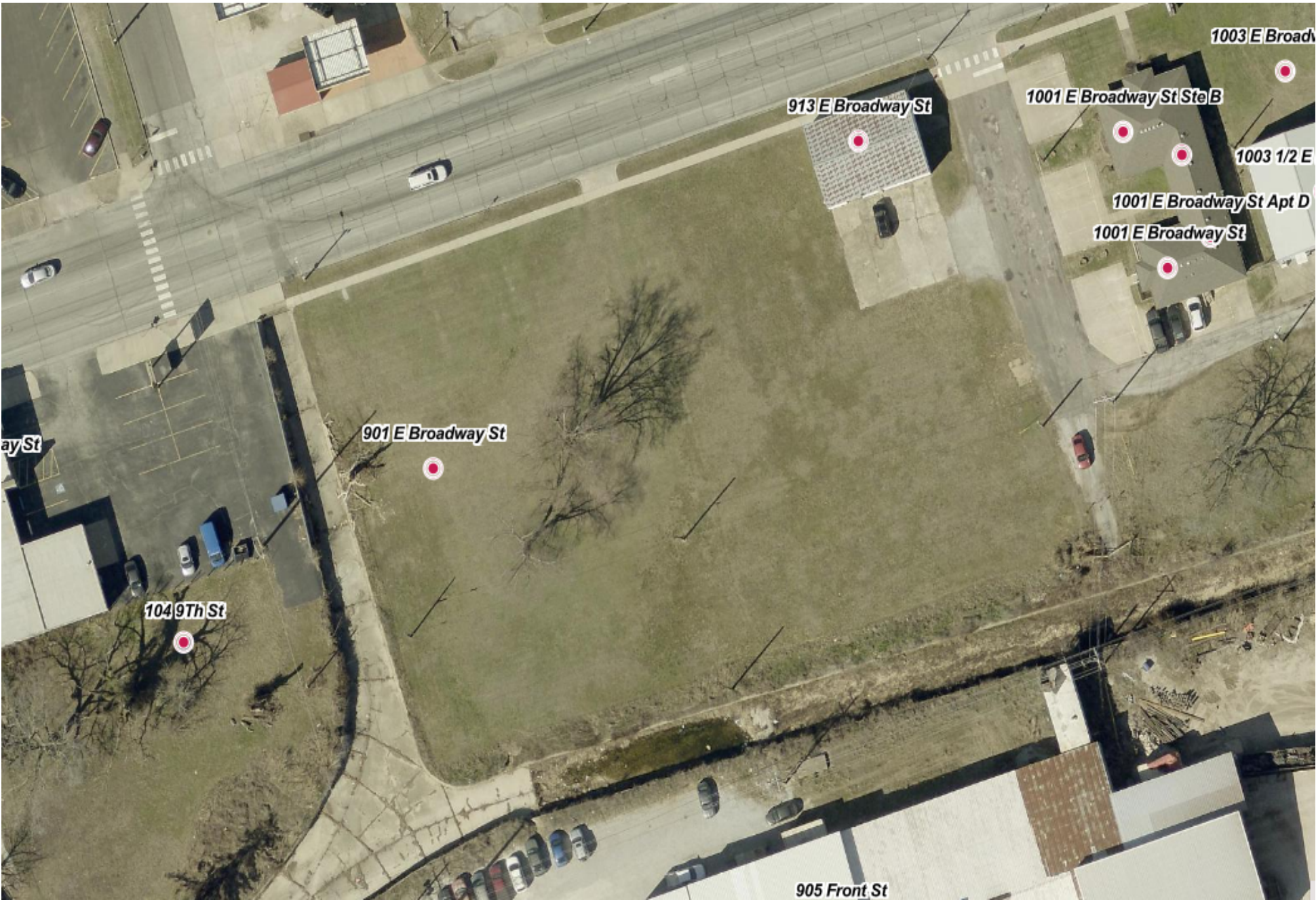
We also request that City Council considers offering Monett Main Street the property between 9th and 10th on Broadway on the south side of the street to complete the dog park project.

Dog Parks

The Humane Society reports about 40% of American households currently own at least one dog. Based on a growing demand, the Trust for Public Lands reports there has been an increase of almost 90% in the number of dog parks in the U.S. since 2007. As members work to address the interest in dog parks, there are many unique risks to the public and their pets which should be managed to minimize liability exposures. The primary areas of focus include appropriate policies, procedures, and signage.

Recommended Rules and Regulations:

Rules and regulations for dog parks should be displayed on a large, permanent sign affixed to the fence, or immediately posted outside the fence near all entrances of the dog park. Emergency and non-emergency contact information for your entity should be prominently posted. Recommended rules and practices should include:

- Users of the dog park do so at their own risk. (member name) shall not be liable for any injury or damage caused by any dog in the dog park.
- Any bite of a person or other dog must be immediately reported to the posted emergency phone number. The persons and dogs involved must wait for an officer to respond, except in the case where immediate medical care is needed.
- Owners are legally responsible for their dogs and any injuries caused by them.
- Dogs must be leashed and removed from the dog park at the first sign of aggression or mounting behavior.
- Children 8 years and under are not allowed in the dog park; children ages 9 to 15 years must be accompanied by an adult.
- Handlers must be 16 years of age or older.
- All park gates must remain closed at all times other than during entry and/or exit; only one gate shall be open at any one time, and then only to enter or exit the dog park.
- The dog park area is for dogs, their handlers and those accompanying them. No other use is allowed and no animals other than dogs shall be permitted.
- All dogs must be in good health, free of communicable diseases or open sores/wounds, legally licensed, vaccinated, and shall wear visible tags on a collar at all times.
- Dogs under 4 months of age and female dogs in heat are prohibited.
- All dogs shall be leashed until inside the dog park.
- Chasing or running with the dogs is not allowed.
- No dog toys or rawhide are allowed in the dog park.

- Dogs must be under the control of and within view of their owner/handler at all times.
- Spike collars are prohibited.
- A handler is limited to a maximum of three dogs and must have one leash in hand for each dog under their control.
- Handlers must clean up after their dogs, removing and disposing of pet waste and filling any holes dug by dogs under their control.
- Smoking, alcoholic beverages, food, and any glass containers are not permitted in the dog park. Training treats for dogs are permitted.
- The dog park is closed when City/County/Park Board personnel are conducting maintenance.

Considerations to Promote Safety and Limit Liability Exposure:

- Post rules and related information on your website so new dog park users can educate themselves regarding the park before their first visit.
- An available running water supply for dogs in the park is important. Large buckets of standing water can spread disease between dogs and can become a perfect breeding ground for mosquitoes. A high-low water fountain for people and pets is ideal for dog parks.
- There should be adequate fencing which dogs cannot dig under or jump over.
- There should be adequate parking so that dog owners/handlers can drive to the dog park and park their cars, as opposed to walking large numbers of dogs on nearby streets, and taking up parking spaces required by the residents.
- There should be at least one gate that securely latches. Consider using two gates, so that a dog rushing through the first cannot get past the second.
- Strongly consider a “small dog” area, segregated by appropriate fencing from the “large dog” area. Separate signage indicating size or weight for the “small dog” area is appropriate.
- Encourage all users to survey dog park activities upon arrival before bringing their dog into the park. Users can check for aggressive behavior of other dogs.
- Provide waste bags and trash receptacles, which allow users to gather and dispose of pet waste in a sanitary manner.
- Conduct a regular review of live park utilization, complaints, reports of incidents and maintenance records to determine if changes are needed.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The City Council desires to consider the use of Chapter 353, RSMo. economic development incentives to aid in the redevelopment and revitalization of historic downtown Monett. The Council has conducted work sessions related to the use and formation of Chapter 353.

The City held two informational sessions for the public. One was conducted on Wednesday, September 3 and the second on Thursday, September 4. The sessions were held on different days and at different times to allow for greater participation. A third and fourth session will be held on Thursday, October 23 at noon and 6:00pm. Notice has been sent in English and Spanish to all property owners within the proposed district. The final district boundaries will be established upon approval of the Redevelopment Plan Committee.

The Monett Main Street Board of Directors has voted to support the use of Chapter 353. In addition, the Monett Chamber of Commerce has acted in like manner to support the initiative.

The use of Chapter 353 is to allow development by property owners with the assurance of property tax abatement. The guidelines for the projects and abatements will be defined by the establishment of the Redevelopment Plan Committee.

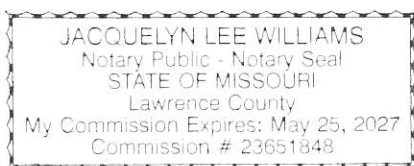

A. In District "D," no building, structure, land or premises shall be used, and no building or structure shall be erected, moved, constructed or altered, except for one (1) or more of the following uses:

1. Any use permitted in District "C" except for residential dwelling units.
2. Awning manufacture.
3. Basket material factories.
4. Billboards and advertising signs, provided that such billboards or signs shall not be located on the public right-of-way, in water or sewer main easements or within five (5) feet horizontally from any overhead primary power lines. Signs that would be considered by the City to be a potential hazard to traffic visibility shall be pole mounted and shall be elevated not less than six (6) feet so as not to cause a traffic visibility hazard. Any encroachments into the public right-of-way shall comply with the ICC International Building Code, as amended.
5. Blacksmith shops.
6. Bottling works.
7. Bowling alleys, dance halls, skating rinks and similar commercial recreation buildings.
8. Breweries or distilleries.
9. Button or novelty factories.
10. Canning and preserving factories.
11. Chemical laboratories.
12. Cleaning, pressing and dyeing establishments.
13. Coal, coke or wood yards.
14. Cold storage plants.
15. Contractor's plant or storage yard.

1. Editor's Note: Ord. No. 8361 §3, 6-20-2015, set out that the lawful use of a residential dwelling unit in District "D" or District "LD" existing on June 1, 2015, may be continued, although such use does not conform with the provisions of this Chapter, and such use may be extended throughout the building; provided, that no structural alterations, except those required by law or ordinance, are made therein; provided further, that no extension shall be made, except by special permit from the Board of Zoning Adjustment in case of evident hardship.

If a school, church or day care facility is established within the prohibited distance following construction or opening of a conforming marijuana facility, the marijuana business may remain at that location as a permitted use.

Section 400.110. Height and Area Regulations. [R.O. 2012 §400.110; CC 1979 §32-12; Ord. No. A-1867 §7, 2-22-1984; Ord. No. A-6432 §3, 1-31-1997]

- A. In District "D", the height of buildings, the minimum dimensions of lots and yards and the minimum lot area per family permitted upon any lot used for residential purposes shall be as follows:
1. *Height.* No building shall exceed four (4) stories or fifty-five (55) feet in height.
 2. *Rear yard.* For buildings or portions of buildings used for residential purposes, a rear yard of not less than fifteen (15) feet shall be provided. No rear yard is required on other buildings.
 3. *Side yards.* There shall be a side yard on each side of a building used exclusively for residential purposes, of not less than five (5) feet in width; provided, that this width shall

be increased one (1) inch for each foot of height of such building above thirty-five (35) feet.

4. *Lot area per family.* Every building or portion of a building erected, moved or altered for residential purposes in District "D" after August 8, 1961, shall provide a lot area of not less than four hundred (400) square feet per family.
5. Frontage for every building or structure used for residential purposes shall be not less than sixty (60) feet, along the City street right-of-way.

ARTICLE III

District "B" — Second Residential (Multiple Dwelling) District

A. In District "B", no building, structure, land or premises shall be used, and no building or structure shall be erected, moved, constructed or altered, except for one (1) or more of the following uses:

1. Any use permitted in District "A".
2. Apartment houses.
3. Boardinghouses or lodging houses.
4. Churches.
5. Farming or truck gardening; provided, that no obnoxious fertilizers are stored or used on the premises.
6. Fraternity or sorority houses.
7. Hospitals, sanitariums or clinics, other than for tubercular, alcoholic, narcotic, or insane patients.
8. Mortuaries.
9. Music studios providing instruction in musical skills and selling music and musical instruments in conjunction with such instruction; provided, that such music studios are not offensive by reason of excessive noise.
10. Nurseries and greenhouses; provided, that no obnoxious fertilizers are stored or used on the premises.
11. Philanthropic or eleemosynary uses or institutions, other than a penal or correctional institution.
12. Private clubs, except clubs the chief activity of which is a service customarily carried on as a business.
13. Telephone business and switchboard office and related facilities; provided, that no building or structure constructed or used for such purpose shall be located nearer than five (5) feet from the lot line of any immediately adjoining and contiguous lot, upon which a residence or dwelling house is situated at the time a building or structure is constructed or first used for such purpose, and that no such building or structure shall be situated nearer to the street than any residence located upon an immediately adjoining and contiguous lot.
14. Two-family private residences.

15. Private or parochial schools, colleges and universities.
16. Hotels and apartment hotels, including only such facilities as are customarily required for the operation of a hotel or apartment hotel or for the use of or entertainment of guests or tenants; provided, that such facilities are conducted and entered from within the building; provided further, that no window or other display or sign is used to advertise the same.
17. Customary home occupations, such as the office of physician, dentist, surgeon, veterinarian, dressmaker, caterer, musician, artist, beautician or barber, under the following restrictions: That such uses are located in the dwelling used by a person as his/her private residence; that no assistant, except that of a receptionist or secretary, other than a member of the family household, is employed; and that no window display or sign, either illuminated or more than one (1) square foot in area, is used to advertise the same.
18. One (1) realtor with no more than one (1) employee with off-street parking.
19. Patio-homes (zero-lot-line homes) under the following conditions:
 - a. Two-unit homes are allowed, with each side under separate ownership.
 - b. The lot line shall be the common dividing line.
 - c. On the common dividing line (common lot line) a residential firewall as defined in the International Building Code shall be built as the separation wall.
 - d. Each unit shall have a separate water meter, electrical meter, gas meter (if gas service is desired), sewer service line, driveway, address, and sanitation container.
 - e. Minimum lot area per unit is three thousand seven hundred fifty (3,750) square feet.
 - f. All height and area regulations shall be the same as other District "B" regulations except the side setback distance on the common dividing line (common lot line) shall be zero (0). Frontage for residential patio homes shall be not less than fifty (50) feet along the City street right-of-way for each individual lot.
 - g. Patio homes larger than two (2) units shall not be allowed.
- B. The Zoning and Planning Commission may permit community garages in District "B", under the following limitations:
 1. Such building shall be set back from the street line a distance of not less than ten (10) feet greater than the building line established by this Chapter.
 2. No commercial vehicles shall be housed in such community garages.
 3. Vehicles may be washed therein, but no commercial use of its premises shall be permitted.
 4. Such building shall not provide space for the storage of more than the total number of

vehicles permitted by this Chapter to be stored on the lots served by such garage.

5. Access thereto, if from the street, shall be by not more than one (1) driveway.

Section 400.070. Height and Area Regulations. [R.O. 2012 §400.070; CC 1979 §32-7; Ord. No. A-1867 §5, 2-22-1984; Ord. No. A-6432 §1, 1-31-1997; Ord. No. 7520 §2, 1-31-2005]

A. In District "B", the height of buildings, the minimum dimensions of lots and yards and the minimum lot area per family permitted upon any lot used for residential purposes shall be as follows:

1. *Height.* No building erected or structurally altered after August 8, 1961, shall exceed three (3) stories or forty-five (45) feet in height, except as otherwise provided in this Chapter.
2. *Rear yard.* The depth of the rear yard shall be not less than twenty percent (20%) of the depth of the lot; provided, that such depth need not be more than twenty (20) feet.
3. *Front yard.* Same as District "A".
4. *Side yards.* Same as District "A".
5. *Lot area per family.* Every building or portion of building erected, moved or altered for residential purposes in District "B" after August 8, 1961, shall provide a lot area per family as specified in District "A", in the case of one-family dwellings, three thousand seven hundred fifty (3,750) square feet per family in two-family dwellings and not less than one thousand (1,000) square feet per family in apartment houses.
6. Frontage for every building or structure used for residential purposes shall be not less than sixty (60) feet, along the City street right-of-way. Frontage for residential patio homes shall be not less than fifty (50) feet along the City street right-of-way for each individual lot.
7. *Garage area per lot.* No private garage shall provide space for storage for more than one (1) vehicle for each one thousand (1,000) square feet of lot area.

ARTICLE II
District "A" — First Residential (Single-Family) District

Section 400.040. Use Regulations. [R.O. 2012 §400.040; CC 1979 §32-4; Ord. No. A-1867 §1, 2-22-1984]

- A. In District "A", no building, structure, land or premises shall be used, and no building or structure shall be erected, moved, constructed or altered, except for one (1) or more of the following uses:
1. *One-family private residences.* "One-family" shall be defined as one (1) or more persons who are related by blood or marriage, living together and occupying a single housekeeping unit with single kitchen facilities, or a group of not more than five (5) persons, excluding servants, living together by joint agreement and occupying a single housekeeping unit with single kitchen facilities, on a non-profit, cost sharing basis; or any group home which shall include any home in which eight (8) or fewer unrelated mentally or physically handicapped persons reside, and may include two (2) additional persons acting as houseparents or guardians who need not be related to each other or to any of the mentally or physically handicapped persons residing in the home; and shall include, but not be limited to, any private residence licensed by the Division of Family Services or Department of Mental Health to provide foster care to one (1) or more but less than seven (7) children who are unrelated to either foster parent by blood, marriage or adoption. No group home shall be located within two thousand five hundred (2,500) feet of another group home. The exterior appearance of the home and property shall be in reasonable conformance with the general neighborhood standards. Group homes shall be eleemosynary or not-for-profit in nature.
 2. Public schools, public parks and playgrounds, golf courses, except miniature golf courses, driving ranges and similar activities operated as a business, museums, libraries, recreational buildings, fire stations or other public buildings of uses owned, controlled and operated exclusively by the City, the State or the United States.
 3. Accessory buildings, including a private garage, when situated upon the same lot with the main building and not less than sixty (60) feet from the front street line and, in the case of corner lots, no closer to the side street than is permitted for residences on that lot; except, that a private garage may be constructed as an integral part of the main building, subject to the height and area regulations of the main building.
- B. No billboards, signboards or advertising signs shall be permitted; except that a "For Sale" or "For Rent" sign no larger than four (4) square feet may be used and, during construction of a building, one (1) sign no larger than eight (8) square feet may be used advertising contractors or architects of such building.

Section 400.050. Height and Area Regulations.¹ [R.O. 2012 §400.050; CC 1979 §32-5; Ord. No. A-1867 §4, 2-22-1984; Ord. No. A-5055 §1, 11-30-1988]

- A. In District "A", the height of buildings, the minimum dimensions of lots and yards and the

1. Cross Reference — As to residences using a private sewage disposal system, §400.130.

minimum lot area per family permitted upon any lot shall be as follows:

1. *Height.* No building erected or structurally altered after August 8, 1961, shall exceed two and one-half (2½) stories or thirty-five (35) feet in height, except as otherwise provided in this Chapter.
2. *Rear yard.* The depth of the rear yard shall be not less than twenty percent (20%) of the depth of the lot; provided that such depth need not be more than twenty (20) feet.
3. *Front yard.* There shall be a front yard not less than twenty percent (20%) of the depth of the lot, but such front yard need not be more than twenty-five (25) feet, except as otherwise provided in this Chapter.
4. *Side yard.* There shall be a side yard on each side of a building not less than ten percent (10%) of the width of the lot, but in no event less than seven (7) feet in width. Buildings on corner lots where interior lots have been platted on side streets shall provide a side yard adjacent to the side of the street of not less than fifty percent (50%) of the front yard established for buildings on interior lots on the side street; provided, that this regulation shall not be so interpreted as to reduce the buildable width of a corner lot of record on August 8, 1961, to less than sixty-five percent (65%) of the total width of such lot; provided further, that the minimum side yard regulations in this Section must be observed. Accessory buildings on corner lots, where interior lots have been platted on side streets, shall not project beyond the front yard line established on the side street; provided, that this regulation shall not reduce the buildable width to less than twenty (20) feet.
5. *Lot area per family.* Every building or portion of a building erected, moved or altered for residence purposes in District "A" after August 8, 1961, shall provide a lot area of not less than seven thousand five hundred (7,500) square feet per family, with a frontage of not less than sixty (60) feet; provided, that where a lot, any contiguous lots or any tract has less area than herein required in separate ownership on such date, this regulation shall not prohibit the erection of a one-family dwelling on such lot, contiguous lots or tract.
6. *House area per lot and family.* Every building or portion of building erected, moved or altered for residence purposes in District "A" after August 8, 1961, shall contain not less than eight hundred (800) square feet of floor space, exclusive of garage or carport, per family.
7. *Garage area per lot.* In District "A", no private garage shall provide storage for more than one (1) vehicle for every three thousand (3,000) square feet of lot area.

MECHANIC SHOP REPORT

September 2025



Week of September 1 through September 5, 2025:

- Labor Day holiday
- Replaced Street Stump Grinder teeth, repaired the connector on the South Park trailer, tightened a fitting on the hydraulic pump on Electric 10 and lubricated the 2nd stage digger latch.
- Replaced the hydraulic hose on the grab arm lower cylinder on Sanitation 40, installed battery shut off switch on Electric 10, Replaced gutter broom and main broom, swapped liner for end to end on Street 44. Checked codes on Sanitation 40.
- Parts run to Springfield to pick up the Vactor pony motor radiator,
- Replaced the South Park John Deere 1550 mower belt on deck, installed Water 36 Vactor pony motor radiator, replaced Street Stump grinder teeth, serviced Electric 7, installed battery shut off switch on Electric 19 and installed wheels on a mech shop workbench.

Week of September 8 through September 12, 2025:

- Serviced MPD-4, repaired a broken mower deck on a Cemetery John Deere 1545 mower, installed a battery shut off switch on Electric 13 and Victory Technology installed a new radio in unit.
- Service call on MFD Ladder Truck to troubleshoot unable to reverse.
- Parts runs to Mount Vernon, Springfield and Joplin (twice).
- Sanitation 40 had the same fault code again, completed repairs to the broken Cemetery JD 1545 mower deck, replaced the starter for the South Park JD 1545 mower, replacement of head and valves in progress on the Brush Site generator-ordered parts, troubleshoot Street 28 DEF derate-open circuit on the tank heater. Tech arrived and confirmed codes mean DEF heater needs replacement on Street 28.
- Ordered Street Dept snowplow blades from Viking-Cives Midwest.
- Replaced the right front wheel on the Street Graco 3900 paint cart, installed a new pivot pin for the Street 28 dump bed, replaced seals and added oil on the Cemetery JD 1545 mower, replaced the Water Dept backhoe battery, replaced a pulley on the South Park JD 1550 mower. Cleaned fuel intake and exhaust, refueled a South Park Stihl Chainsaw, troubleshoot a North Park hose reel that was running for 10 seconds, then shutting down.

- The Senior Mechanic attended a department head meeting from 8-11 AM.

Week of September 15 through September 19, 2025:

- Troubleshoot and repaired Street 28 dump bed failure to lift. Parts run to Aurora for DEF heater & parts, replaced the DEF heater.
- Serviced Electric 14, the MPD Chief's Tahoe (and replaced battery on 9/22/25), MPD-5, Sanitation 40 and MFD 1129.
- Jump started the Water Dept vacuum trailer, welded a broken picnic table near the South Park kitchen, jump started the Street Patchwagon engine, removed starter generators from 2 golf carts and took to Mike's Alternators for overhaul, Street 22's oil dipstick is coming apart, researched replacement/repair. Researched replacement tracks for the Cemetery 303C Mini-X.
- Parts runs to Springfield and Joplin (twice).
- Installed new laptop mount and boxes in the new MPD Police Interceptor and checked battery amps. Replaced pull cord that came out on the North Park hose reel, replaced the alternator on the old MPD-10, the water pump needs replacement, troubleshoot failure to keep running after primed on Water Dept Well 20 Generator, troubleshoot the dump bed being jammed on the North Park John Deere Gator.
- Serviced Sanitation 40 and installed work light on passenger side, forward and above can lift.
- Street Forklift unloaded CEM Cat tracks from MECH 8, put MPD 10 plates on new MPD Police Interceptor, removed battery to have checked for condition, replaced a hydraulic hose on the rear compactor cylinder on Sanitation 42, jump started Airport bucket truck to move for mowing and moved old Street 44 for mowing as well.
- Completed repairs on the Water Dept Well 20 Generator, installed new fuel pump.

Week of September 22 through September 26, 2025:

- Troubleshoot fan section vibration on Water 36 Vactor, began fan disassembly, requested parts quote.
- Assisted with installing a new wheel on a Sanitation dumpster, assisted with plow attachment on Street 28, troubleshoot hydraulic leaks on Electric 12, checked and cleared codes on Water 37, welded the rear passenger platform bracket on Sanitation 42 and reattached the driver side dumpster latch, replaced bolt & nut on the passenger side dumpster latch.
- Dealt with invoice & part mistakenly sent to Monett by Armor Equipment.
- Serviced Electric 15, MPD-8 (and checked charging system), Street 76 and Sanitation 42. Serviced Street 44 engine and installed new brooms.
- MPD will take new MPD-10 to Jimmy Michel Motors for troubleshooting of battery and electrical system.
- Troubleshoot and repaired city hall GMC Terrain brake issues, troubleshoot Water 36 Vactor oil leaks (removed fan housing to expose gearbox oil leaks), jump started the Street Patchwagon again, relocated ballast weights on the Street paint cart, worked on 2 mowers,

a garage door & other misc. equipment for the Golf Course, installed backup alarm on Street 78, obtained new motor for portable MFD fan and installed, installed new outrigger pads on the Street 580 Super N.

- Notified MFD 1113 ready for pickup. MFD picked up from Springfield.
- Old MPD-10 was returned by Connolly Trucking after water pump & timing chain replacement.

September 29 and 30, 2025:

- Completed the Brush Site Generator repairs.
- MPD-8 stalled, battery light came on. Mechanics replicated the problem more than once, no codes came in. Under warranty. Contacted Jimmy Michel for an appointment on 10/9/25 at 8:30 AM for troubleshooting and repair.
- Parts run to pick up glass for WWTP 62 and replaced passenger side front window, continuing Water 36 Vactor fan rebuild as parts arrive, installed new tracks on the Cemetery 303C Mini-X, replaced the transmission oil and filter for MFD 1128, fabricated a new rear access door latch.

Items of Note:

MFD-1113 was returned from MHC-Kenworth-Springfield after new engine installation for \$45,623.99.

The mechanic shop has received a second truck, which gets significantly better gas mileage than the mechanic service truck.
